

## NMTCB Recognizes ARRT and ASCP Certifications

The Nuclear Medicine Technologist Certification Board (NMTCB) has announced a new policy, effective only during 1990. Under this policy, the Board will recognize nuclear medicine technologist certifications that were awarded before December 31, 1985 by the American Registry of Radiologic Technologists (ARRT) or the American Society of Clinical Pathologists (ASCP). According to NMTCB Chairwoman Karen Blondeau, the new NMTCB policy reflects the Board's desire to recognize the contributions of ARRT and ASCP certificants who have been active in the field for a number of years.

Once ARRT or ASCP certification is recognized, the individual will receive the full benefits of NMTCB registry, including a certificate, use of the CNMT designation, an annual membership card, the NMTCB newsletter, and a listing in the next NMTCB Certificants Annual Directory.

Those who would like to be NMTCB-certified should send a letter of request, a copy of the ARRT or ASCP certificate showing date of issuance, and a \$40 check to: NMTCB, P.O. Box 29103, Atlanta, GA 30329; (404) 493-4504. The NMTCB must receive all application materials during 1990.
