ELECTION PROCESS CHANGES

Revisions of the SNM Bylaws were made at the Annual Meeting in Orlando in June. These revisions will radically change the election process and the terms and titles of elected officers. To accommodate these changes, a transition schedule for elections will require that the ballot for the Spring 1995 include candidates for President-Elect who should be a nonphysician; candidates for Secretary/Treasurer who would serve during the first year as Secretary and the remaining two years as Secretary and Treasurer; and candidates for Vice President-Elect who would be the first individual on a three-year progressive presidency tract. Therefore, the newly elected 1995-1996 Vice President-Elect would eventually become President for 1997-1998. Nominations for President-Elect and Vice President-Elect will be reviewed and voted upon by the nominating committee at the Mid-Winter meeting in February 1995, as will nominations for four Delegates-at-Large and three Chapter Delegatesat-Large (to be assigned to the most under-represented chapters, i.e., Mideastern, Greater New York and Central Chapters). Nominations are submitted to the nominating committee through and with chapter endorsement or by petition from 25 voting members. As chapter meetings begin in the fall, nominations for national office should be an important agenda item at these meetings. VA 22090, and should arrive no later than Dec. 22, 1994.

AWARDS COMMITTEE, SNM JOSEPH STERNBERG STUDENT FELLOWSHIP

Funds for a student fellowship have been donated by friends and family of the late Joseph Sternberg, MD (1912-1991), an endocrinologist-nuclear physician and a pioneer of nuclear medicine. Dr. Sternberg was among the first physicians in the world to work with radioactive isotopes. He began his work under a French student fellowship award similar to those awarded by the Society of Nuclear Medicine Education and Research Foundation. Dr. Sternberg served as vice president of SNM in 1963 and was instrumental in founding the World Federation of Nuclear Medicine and Biology and the Journal of Nuclear Medicine and Biology where he was the first scientific editor. In recognition of his scientific achievements and his contributions to the establishment of the field of nuclear medicine, a fund has been set up in his memory to further the training of a selected young
