#### **CALL FOR APPLICANTS**

The Henri Becquerel Prize of the German Society of Nuclear Medicine (DGN), sponsored by DuPont Pharma Inc., is seeking applicants. This prize will honor the memory and achievements of Henri Antoine Becquerel, discoverer of natural radioactivity. The award should serve to support a period of research abroad for young German scientists, or to support international colleagues during their stay in Germany. Prior achievements in the field of nuclear medicine are a prerequisite; the award should permit a period of in-depth research, either at a university at home or abroad, into a topic with which the applicant is acquainted.

Application for the prize requires completed research that has utilized nuclear techniques. Candidates must be 35 years old or younger. Deadline for receipt of applications is January 15, 1998. Applications must be submitted (original and three copies) to the chairman of the DGN. The winner will be determined by a five-person jury. The prize will be awarded during the annual meeting of the DGN. **Student Fellowships**—These grants are designed to stimulate interest among students in the United States and Canada. These awards provide an opportunity to spend elective quarters and/or summers working with experts in the field. Maximum grant is \$3000 for three months. Ranking of the candidate will be based on the quality and originality of the research proposal submitted. Applicants must provide the information requested in the application form for consideration. Decisions on candidates' ranking will be made at the Mid-Winter and Annual Meetings of SNM. The number of candidates to whom awards will be made is determined by the funds available for student fellowships. Application deadlines: December 15, 1997 and May 1, 1998.

**Pilot Research Grants**—These grants are intended to provide seed money to scientists working in the nuclear medicine field. Such proposals must be of a pilot nature in either clinical or basic research. Maximum grant is \$5000. Applicants must provide the information requested in the application form for consideration, including justification of why this is a pilot research grant and how it will allow the applicant to fully develop his or her research program. Decisions on such grants, based on available funding, will be made at the Mid-Winter and Annual Meetings of SNM. Application deadlines: December 15, 1997 and May 1, 1998.

Tetalman Award—Established by the family and friends of Marc Tetalman, MD, this fund provides an annual award of \$2500 to one investigator [36 years old or younger or within 7 years of award of degree (MD or PhD)] in nuclear medicine for his or her accomplishments. Applications must include a curriculum vitae, a statement detailing research accomplishments and future goals, three or more letters of recommendation from established investigators and up to three selected reprints. Application deadline: March 1, 1998.

Paul D. Cole Scholarships—Established by the SNM-Technologist Section and the family and friends of Paul D. Cole, twelve \$1000 scholarships, for each of the three types of nuclear medicine technology training programs (certificate, associate, baccalaureate), are available for qualified applicants. Application deadline: May 1, 1998.

Benedict Cassen Prize—This prize honors Benedict Cassen, whose invention of the rectilinear radioisotope scanner—the first instrument capable of making an image of a body organ in a patient—was seminal to the development of clinical nuclear medicine. The prize is intended to recognize a significant achievement in nuclear medicine and is to be awarded to a living scientist or physician scientist. The prize may be increased, in exceptional circumstances, if it is shared by more than one individual. The prize will be awarded at the Annual Meeting of SNM, during which the recipient may present a featured lecture. A panel of distinguished national and international scientists and/or physician scientists will assist in selecting the recipient. Nomination deadline: November 1, 1997.

Benedict Cassen Postdoctoral Fellowship—This fellowship is awarded to recent doctoral degree recipients demonstrating an excellent academic record and exceptional research ability. Its purpose is to broaden recipients' basic exposure to nuclear medicine research at an institution different from that conferring the doctoral degree. The award, amounting to \$25,000 per year for two years, is contingent upon satisfactory performance in the first year. Application deadline: January 3, 1998.


