CHARLES J. HLAD, JR. 1920-1966



The Rocky Mountain Chapter of the Society of Nuclear Medicine regrets to announce the sudden death, on August 27, 1966, of Mr. Charles J. (Whitey) Hlad, Jr., a member of the Board of Trustees of The Society of Nuclear Medicine. Mr. Hlad was Chief of the Medical Research Laboratory at the Veterans Administration Hospital in Denver, Colorado, and a pioneer in nuclear medicine. He graduated from the University of Chicago in 1943 and received a Masters Degree at Stanford University in 1949. During his college days, he set several world record marks in running the high hurdles. During World War II, he served with the U.S. Army in the Chemical Warfare Division. Mr. Hlad joined the Veterans Hospital Staff in Denver in 1949 as a physicist and was named Head of the Research Laboratory in 1961. He is survived by his wife, Marilu, a son, Jeffrey, aged 10, and a daughter, Lauren, aged 6.
