The Scientific Program Committee welcomes the submission of abstracts from technologists for the meeting. Abstracts must be submitted on the official abstract form. In addition, the Program Committee encourages submission of abstracts from students presently enrolled in schools of nuclear medicine technology.

Accepted abstracts will be published in the March 1978 issue of the *Journal of Nuclear Medicine Technology*. An award will be given for the best paper.

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FIRST CALL FOR EXHIBITS: SCIENTIFIC PROGRAM

The Scientific Program Committee invites the submission of abstracts of exhibits for the Fifth Annual Winter Meeting of the Society of Nuclear Medicine, Technologist Section. Applications are welcomed from all technologists. The Committee also welcomes exhibits that complement presented papers for the Scientific Program.

All exhibits will be illuminated by available room light. There will be no provisions for transillumination, e.g., viewboxes. The exhibit should be mounted on poster board not exceeding 30 × 30 in. No more than two boards may be entered for a subject. Exhibits should be clearly titled. Submit the following information with your application: exhibitor's name and affiliation, title of exhibit (ten words maximum), abstract (100 words), and dimensions (the maximum of two boards not exceeding 30 × 30 in.).

An award will be presented to the most outstanding exhibit based on scientific merit, originality, display format, and appearance.
