Therefore, only abstracts prepared on the official abstract form will be considered with original forms required for each abstract submitted. To ensure that all those interested in submitting abstracts receive the form, a copy of the abstract form will be placed in the DECEMBER and JANUARY issues of the *Journal*. However, if you require additional forms, they may be obtained from the Society at the address below. The original abstract and twelve copies with supporting data (three pages maximum) attached to each are required.

Abstracts of completed and on-going ("works in progress") projects will be judged together based on scientific merit. The deadline for submitting all abstracts for the scientific program is **February 16, 1979**.

The Journal of Nuclear Medicine reserves the privilege of first review of all contributed papers presented at the Annual Meeting of the Society.
