**SNM 1996-1997 Election**—The Spring 1996 Ballot will include candidates for vice president-elect and historian. As a reminder, a vote for the vice president-elect will also designate the officer who will serve as president two years hence (the candidate elected vice president-elect for 1996-1997 will serve as vice president 1997-1998 and president 1998-1999). Due to the integration of the ACNP Annual Meeting and SNM Mid-Winter Meeting in Puerto Rico on January 9-16, 1996, the deadline for all nominations has been moved up to November 22, 1995. This includes the candidate's curriculum vitae, 5" x 7" black and white photograph and platform statement (vice president-elect candidate only).

At the January 1996 Mid-Winter Meeting, the Nominating Committee will review nominations for vice president-elect, historian, four delegates-at-large and four chapter delegates (to be assigned to the most under represented chapter's—Central, Mideastern, Southeastern and Southwestern). and/or summers working with experts in the field. Maximum grant is \$3000 for three months. Ranking of the candidate will be based on the quality and originality of the research proposal submitted. Applicants must provide the information requested in the application form for consideration. Decisions on candidate's ranking will be made at the Mid-Winter and Annual Meeting of the Society of Nuclear Medicine. The number of candidates to whom awards will be made is determined by the funds available for student fellowships. Application deadlines: December 15, 1995 and May 1, 1996.

**Pilot Research Grants**—These grants are intended to provide seed money to scientists working in the nuclear medicine field. Such proposals must be of a pilot nature in either clinical or basis research. Maximum grant: \$5000. Applicants must provide the information requested in the application form for consideration, including justification of why this is a pilot research grant and how it will allow the applicant to fully develop his/her research program. Decisions on such grants, based on available funding, will be made at the Mid-Winter and Annual Meeting of the Society of Nuclear Medicine. Application deadlines: December 15, 1995 and May 1, 1996.

**Tetalman Memorial Award**—Established by the family and friends of Marc Tetalman, MD, this fund provides an annual award of \$2500 to one investigator (36 years or younger or within 7 years of their award of degree (MD or PhD)) in nuclear medicine for his/her accomplishments. Applications must include a curriculum vitae, a statement detailing research accomplishments and future goals, three or more letters of recommendations from established investigators, and up to three selected reprints. Application deadline: March 1, 1996.

**Paul D. Cole Scholarships**—Established by the SNM-Technologist Section and the family and friends of Paul D. Cole, twelve \$1000 scholarships, one for each of the three types of nuclear medicine technology training programs (certificate, associate, baccalaureate) are available for qualified applicants. Application deadline: May 1, 1996.

**Benedict Cassen Postdoctoral Fellowship**—This fellowship is awarded to recent doctoral degree recipients demonstrating an excellent academic record and exceptional research ability. Its purpose is to broaden recipients' basic exposure to nuclear medicine research at an institution different from that conferring the doctoral degree. The award, amounting to \$25,000 per year, for two years, is contingent upon satisfactory performance in the first year. Application deadline: January 3, 1996.

**Benedict Cassen Prize**—This prize honors Benedict Cassen, whose invention of the rectilinear radioisotope scanner— the first instrument capable of making an image of a body organ in a patient— was seminal to the development of clinical nuclear medicine. The prize is intended to recognize a significant achievement in nuclear medicine and is to be awarded to living scientist, or physician scientist but may be increased in exceptional circumstances if the prize is shared by more than one individual. The prize will be awarded at the Annual Meeting of the Society of Nuclear Medicine, during which the recipient may present a featured lecture. A panel of distinguished national and international scientist and/or physician-scientists will assist in selecting the individual. Nomination deadline: November 1, 1995.
