Charles E. Culpeper Foundation Scholarships in Medical Science—The Charles E. Culpeper Foundation is currently accepting applications for its 1998 scholarships in medical science programs designed to support the career development of academic physicians.

Up to three awards of \$100,000 per year for three years will be made to U.S. medical schools on behalf of candidates who are U.S. citizens, have received their MD degree from a U.S. medical school in 1989 or later (the eight-year rule may be waived when there are career interruptions for family and personal reasons), and are judged worthy of support by virtue of the quality of their research proposals. 
