South Africa Hosts WFNMB Congress

he 10th Congress of the World Federation of Nuclear Medicine and Biology (WFNMB) was held September 18–23 in Cape Town, South Africa. More than 800 participants from 63 countries, including 100 speakers, attended the scientific sessions and summits and toured commercial and scientific exhibits. Special features of the meeting were the social events and cultural presentations arranged by host members of the South African Society of Nuclear Medicine. This included the presidential dinner at the Mount Nelson Hotel in Cape Town and the WFNMB 2010 Congress dinner at the Spier Wine Estate.

Most speakers attended at their own expense in a show of support for this international event, to share their expertise, and to meet colleagues from the world. From SNM, attendees included Dominique Delbeke, MD, PhD; Frederic H. Fahey, DSc; Michael M.
