

David L. Yuille, MD, 1942–2014

David Lawrence Yuille, MD, of River Hills, WI, died on November 22 in San Jose, CA, while visiting family. A long-time radiologist and nuclear medicine physician at St. Luke's Medical Center in Milwaukee, WI, he was 72 years old.

Yuille was born in 1942 in Pontiac, MI. He graduated in 1965 with honors from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (Boston, MA) with a bachelor's degree in electrical engineering and minors in mathematics, physics, and chemistry. He received his medical degree in 1969 from the University of Michigan Medical School (Ann Arbor).

During military service from 1969 to 1978, he was stationed at the Letterman Army Medical Center (LAMC; San Francisco, CA). While there, he completed his radiology residency and nuclear medicine fellowship. He became Assistant Chief of Nuclear Medicine at LAMC and left the Army with the rank of lieutenant colonel.

In 1978, he joined the Milwaukee Radiologists practice group at St. Luke's Medical Center, where he

remained for more than 35 years until his retirement in January 2014. At St. Luke's he was a staff radiologist/nuclear medicine physician in the Department of Nuclear Medicine. He was responsible for all aspects of general nuclear medicine, nuclear cardiology, PET/CT scanning, SPECT/CT scanning, and nuclear medicine therapy, as well as training and teaching nuclear medicine and radiology residents, fellows, technologists, and nuclear medicine technology students.

In addition to devotion to his family, Yuille was an avid reader and an advocate of history and the arts. His interests included science fiction, action movies, fine wine, and good food. His family and

colleagues noted that he will be remembered for his cheerful demeanor, sharp wit, gentle and generous heart, jovial spirit, and unmistakable laughter. He is survived by his wife, Kathleen, and a son and daughter. A memorial service was held on January 10 at the Milwaukee Art Museum.
