SNMMI Mid-Winter Meeting in Palm Springs: Focus on Cardiovascular Imaging

he SNMMI 2019 Mid-Winter Meeting and American College of Nuclear Medicine (ACNM) Annual Meeting will be held January 17–19 at the Renaissance Palm Springs Hotel (CA). This year's specialty focus will be on cardiovascular imaging, and we will offer a full 3-day track on this topic area. In addition, we will offer a general track that covers a wide variety of topics and the Exhibit Hall, which will feature the latest technologies and products in the field.

Nuclear medicine and molecular imaging play a pivotal role in the evaluation, risk stratification, and management of patients with cardiovascular disease. The Mid-Winter Meeting offers both nuclear medicine professionals and cardiologists an opportunity to collaborate, share research developments, and discuss common interests that will improve the care of patients.

The cardiovascular track sessions will cover topics such as:

- improving value and quality in nuclear cardiology;
- PET in the diagnosis and management of cardiac sarcoidosis;
- cardiovascular infection imaging;
- new directions in cardiac PET;
- nuts and bolts of stress perfusion imaging;
- amyloidosis imaging;
- starting a cardiac PET program;
- new SPECT techniques and cameras;
- viability assessment; and
- new developments in cardiology relative to imaging.



The ACNM Annual Meeting will run concurrently with the SNMMI Mid-Winter Meeting. It will, as always, have a scientific program with oral and poster presentations, an exciting plenary session, and a 3-day program that will highlight the latest developments in the clinical practice of nuclear medicine and molecular imaging. The annual ACNM Banquet and Awards Ceremony will be held Friday, January 18, at 7 PM.
